

Bibliography

Every article should be provided with a full bibliography of all sources quoted. The bibliography should be set in the flush-and-hang style (tab stop 0,5 cm). Second and further titles of the same author should start with an *m dash* (—). In case of multi-author publications, the names of the authors should be separated by a slash (/). Titles of articles are surrounded by quotation marks. Titles of books are set in italics. Titles and abbreviations of series and periodicals are not set in italics. Following the place of publication, names of publishing companies (not required) might be indicated after a colon (e.g.: Wiesbaden: Harrassowitz).

Quotations of more than three lines (extracts) should be indented 0,5 cm on the right and on the left side, set in the same type size as the standard text and be separated by half a line (6 pt) from preceding and following text.

Sumerian text: normal font, not bold font; spacing Sumerian is OK, but not recommended due to complexity (šu du₇ nam-ḥe₂ ḥe₂-ḡal₂-la buluḡ₃ -ḡa₂);

Sumerian logograms used as determinatives: normal raised small letters (^deš18-tár, ^{anše}ku-dinī);

Akkadian text: italic letters; numbers, brackets, exclamation marks, question marks are not set in italics (*a-di 2 ši-me-te ša' iš'-tu' [li-mu] ¹A-bat-t[u]*);

Akkadian phonetic complements: italic raised letters (*i-pul^{ml}*);

Sumerian logograms within Akkadian text: normal capital letters (*a-na ÉRIN.MEŠ*):

Hittite text: small letters set in italics;

Akkadograms in Hittite: capital letters set in italics;

Sumerograms within Hittite context: normal capital letters;

Latin text is set in italics;

Greek, Hebrew and Arabic text is never set in italics.

Editions of text imitating the line breaks of the original text: *Tab stops*: 1cm right-adjusted, 1,3 cm left-adjusted

These two styles might serve as suggestions. Modifications are possible, of course.

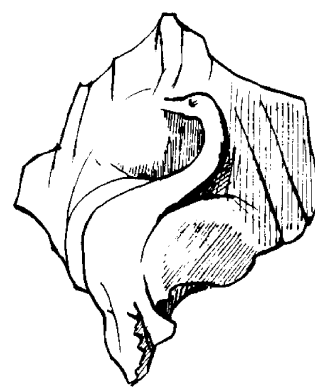

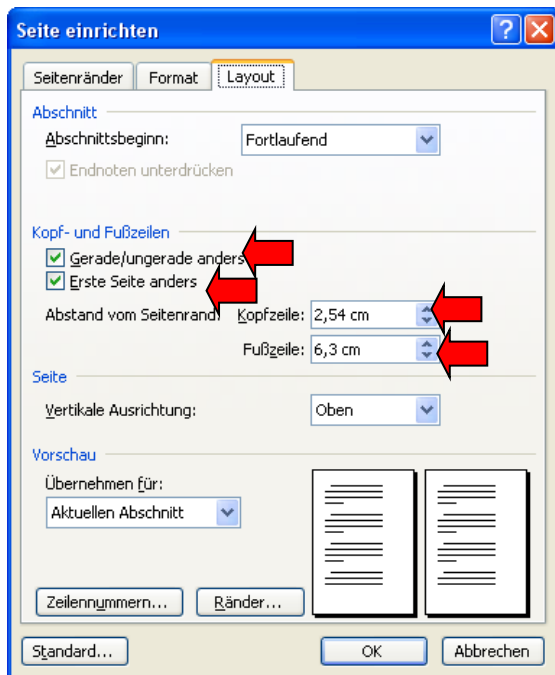
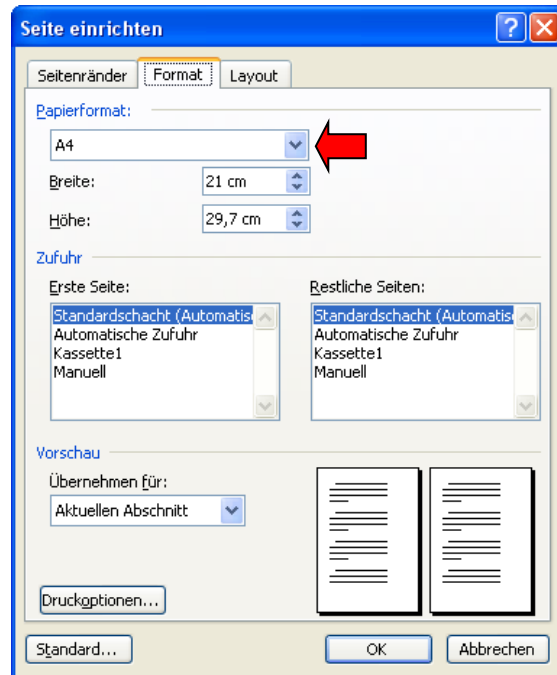
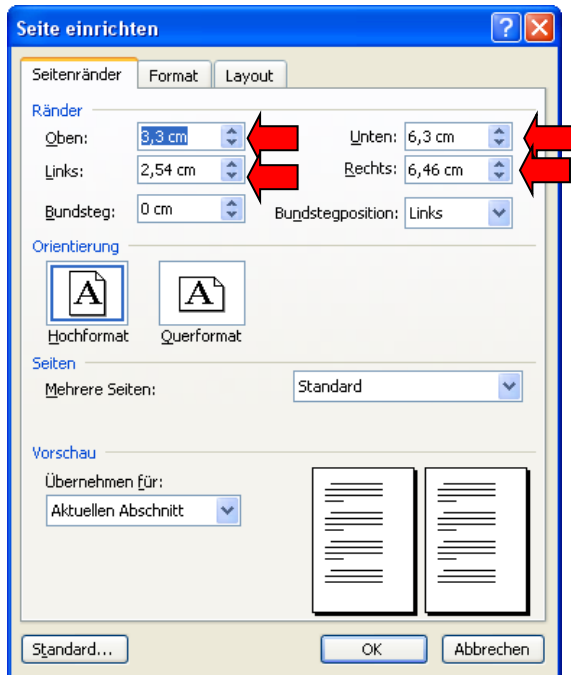
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Page Layout
