EXAMPLES OF ANTI-JEWISH POLICY IN NAZI GERMANY, 1933-1938



- **1933** All non-"Aryans" are dismissed from holding government jobs.
- **1933** A general boycott of all Jewish-owned businesses is proclaimed.
- **1933** Jews are prohibited from holding jobs in the arts and cultural spheres, including in radio, in the theaters, or selling paintings or sculptures.
- **1933** Jews are prohibited from owning land.
- **1933** Jewish lawyers and judges are barred from their professions.
- **1933** Jewish doctors are barred from treating "Aryan" patients.
- 1933 Jews are prohibited from producing kosher meat.
- **1935** The Nuremberg Laws are enacted, defining Jews by racial criteria and depriving them of German citizenship.
- **1935** Marriage and intimate relations between Jews and those of "Aryan" blood are declared criminal acts.

- German females under the age of 45 are prohibited from being employed by Jews.
- Jews are forbidden to wave the Reich's flag or to display the flag's colors.
- The Reich Supreme Court declares that being a Jew is cause for dismissal from a job.
- All Jews are required to add the names "Israel" and "Sarah" to their identification papers, and passports must be marked with the red letter J, for Jude (Jew).
- Jews can no longer attend plays and concerts.
- Jews can no longer own phones or have drivers' licenses and car registrations.
- All Jewish shops are ordered to close by the year's end.
- Jews are required to abide by curfews.
