Test Format:

The Revised Causal Dimension Scale is rated on a 9-point Likert-type scale. The total scores for each dimension are obtained by summing the items, as follows: 1,6,9 = locus of causality; 5, 8, 12 = external control; 3, 7, 11 = stability; 2, 4, 10 = personal control.

Items

Instructions: Think about the reason or reasons you have written above. The items below concern your impressions or opinions of this cause or causes of your performance. Circle one number for each of the following questions.

Is the cause(s) something:
