- Visit a selection of historical and religiously significant sites
- Volunteer in a local soup kitchen
- Pray Hallel songs of praise with the head of the Center for Jewish-Christian Understanding and Cooperation (subject to change)

\$250 for Jewish Instructor + \$50/person half-day or \$75/person full-day.



- Visit ancient Shiloh, the capital of Israel for 369 years and the site of the ancient Tabernacle
- Pray Hallel songs of praise with the head of the Center for Jewish-Christian Understanding and Cooperation (subject to change)
- Plant vines on the Mountain of Blessings, fulfilling prophecy as described in Isaiah 61:5
- Return to Jerusalem and ascend Mount Zion to visit King David's tomb

\$350 for Jewish Instructor + \$50/person half-day or \$75/person full-day. Vine planting is an extra \$30 per person.



- Visit the holy city of Hebron and the Tomb of the Patriarchs, the burial place of Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Sarah, Rebecca and Leah, as well as Ruth and Jesse. Hebron was also the first Capital of Israel under the rule of King David.
- Meet with the Ariel family, whose daughter, Hallel Yaffa, 13, was murdered by Palestinian terrorists in 2016
- Plant trees in the fields of Judea
- Pray Hallel songs of praise with the head of the Center for Jewish-Christian Understanding and Cooperation (subject to change)
- Return to Jerusalem and ascend Mount Zion to visit King David's tomb

\$350 for Jewish Instructor + \$50/person half-day or \$75/person full-day. Tree planting is an extra \$30 per person.



- Visit Qumran, stopping at significant historical and religious sites along the way
- Tour the Shrine of The Book museum

\$350 for Jewish Instructor + \$75/person.

Fees listed above cover tour and instructor costs and entrance fees for a minimum of 10 people. All participants will receive a keepsake packet of relevant Biblical content and other materials. The cost does not include transportation or lunch.
