Thesis title: The Influence of the Biblical Apocalypse upon Julian of Norwich's *Revelations of Love* and William Langland's *Piers Plowman*

- The thesis reveals ways in which these texts engage with the biblical Apocalypse and exegetical writings. It identifies and considers the implications of areas of confluence, including: spiritual warfare; the concept of Christ as conqueror of sin; the Harrowing of Hell; soteriology; the centrality of repristination all salient thematic elements of the Apocalypse which both writers reapply and emphasise. A major contention is that the exegetical approach to the Apocalypse is both more extensive in Julian's *Revelations* and more sophisticated in Langland's *Piers Plowman* than previously thought, whether through the primary textual influence or a discernible Joachite influence. This involves analysing content, style, and structure, in addition to identifying the relevant hermeneutic of each writer in relation to the Apocalypse.
